## Sunday School Classes

There are Sunday School classes for all ages at 10:00 a.m. Age appropriate lessons and crafts are planned for the pre-school and elementary age children as well as thought provoking topics and discussions for youth and adults. Adult classes include:

**Christian Issues...**This class meets in Adult #2 in the Education wing of the church at 10:00 a.m. They focus on current issues and how they affect our Christian lives. Today's lesson will be on *Earthquake in Haiti*. A devastating earthquake struck Haiti in January, causing death and widespread destruction. How is God present in the midst of such tragedy? How can individual Christians and churches help the people in Haiti?

**Young Adult Class...**This Sunday morning group's mission is "To know God, to connect with others, and to give of ourselves," with the primary mission that of knowing God. The Young Adult Sunday study continues to be held at 10 a.m. This class is for anyone who considers themselves a young adult (most are in their 20's and 30's), whether single, engaged, married and/or parenting. They meet in The Intersection.

**Know and Grow...** The Know-and-Grow meets in Adult 1 at 10:00 a.m. All are welcome. This class does Bible study and referencing in conjunction with a book that they choose to read.

**Young Families Class...** This class is for married couples in their 30's and 40's with children. They discuss everyday life issues, family finances, various topics of interest to the group. Anyone interested in these topics related to our faith is invited to the Adult 3 classroom at 10:00 a.m. for the class.

**Lenten Study Offered...**You are invited to participate in a Lenten Contemplative Bible Study. On five Sundays during Lent, beginning on Feb. 21, at 10:00 a.m., a group will gather in the Prayer Room to experience Contemplative Bible Reading. What is that, you may ask? Much of our Bible study is conducted to inform us about the Bible. We read, study, and discuss. We have come to know a lot about the Bible, but we can miss hearing God speak to us through the readings. Come join us for five weeks and be introduced to an ancient spiritual practice. Learn a little of its history, experience it with others, and then take it home and use it to deepen your connection and communication with God. **Walk to Jerusalem...**InTouch is sponsoring a virtual Walk to Jerusalem to promote and deepen spiritual, physical, and emotional health during our Lenten season. We will be taking an imaginary walk from West Lafayette to Jerusalem, Israel. Basically, we will be keeping track of mileage based on physical activity (for example: walking, biking, or exercising of any kind) and spiritual activity (for example: praying, Bible studies, or devotional reading to name a few). Every 20 minutes of physical or spiritual activity will count as 1 mile (unless the actual mileage is greater – for example, if you bike 10 miles an hour, then count 10 miles and not the 3 miles you would earn for the time put into the activity). We'd like to invite the entire congregation to join us in this program. It's a fun way to get a little bit of exercise and deepen our faith at the same time. Look for tally sheets to keep track of your miles starting next Sunday in the Welcome Center. There will be a tally sheet for adults and a different version for kids. **Sermon Series—*That Was Then, This Is Now***

What might we learn if we looked back to a word, a scripture, a sermon from years ago and asked if that word is still relevant, if it was on target, off target, or in serious need of an update? Pastor Burchill has been in the St. Andrew pulpit for going on 15 years, and Pastor Sleeth has been stepping in to fill that pulpit for almost that long (even before he came on staff). For the next few weeks we're going to go back and look at some key moments and important sermons in the life of our church and ask: if that was God's word then, what is God's word now? Back in the spring of 2004 our pastors preached a series: "Everything You Wanted To Know About Grace but Were Afraid to Ask." One of those sermons was entitled, "Ask Doctor Tim" in which Pastor Burchill played the role of radio call in host and responded to specific questions about the sacraments. This morning Pastor Burchill will reconsider a portion of that sermon and address the four most commonly asked questions about holy communion.
