Sunday School Classes

There are Sunday School classes for all ages at 10:00 a.m. Age appropriate lessons and crafts are planned for the pre-school and elementary age children as well as thought provoking topics and discussions for youth and adults. Adult classes include:

Christian Issues....This class meets in Adult #2 in the Education wing of the church at 10:00 a.m. They focus on current issues and how they affect our Christian lives. The topic for today is *Lent*. Today is the first Sunday in Lent. What is Lent? How and why do we observe it? How does observing Lent enrich our lives?

Young Career Age...This Sunday morning group's mission is "To Know God, To Connect with Others, and To Give of Ourselves," with the primary mission that of Knowing God. The Young Adult Sunday study continues to be held at 10 a.m. This class is for anyone who considers themselves a young adult (most are in their 20's and 30's), whether single, engaged, married and/or parenting. We usually start with some community time and breakfast munchies then dig into our lesson of the week. They meet in The Intersection.

Know and Grow...The Know and Grow class is beginning a new study on the Parable of the Prodigal Son (based on Henri Nouwen's book *The Return of the Prodigal Son*), will focus this Sunday morning on the "leaving of the younger son." The class will discuss questions such as: What is home (spiritual)? Why do we leave home? What is it that we are trying to prove by leaving home? What are signs that we have left home? Why does the father not restrain the son? Come join us for the study/discussion at 10:00 a.m. in Adult 1.
Young Families Class... This class is for married couples in their 30's and 40's with children. They discuss everyday life issues, family finances, various topics of interest to the group. Anyone interested in these topics related to our faith is invited to the Adult #3 classroom at 10:00 a.m. for the class.

Lenten Contemplative Bible Study...You are invited to participate in a Lenten Contemplative Bible Study during the Sunday school hour in the Prayer Room. A lot Bible study is conducted to inform us about the Bible. We have come to know a lot about the Bible, but we can miss hearing God speak to us through the readings. Come join us for five weeks and be introduced to an ancient spiritual practice. Learn a little of its history, experience it with others, and then take it home and use it to deepen your connection and communication with God. Margie Sharples can answer any questions you have about the study.
