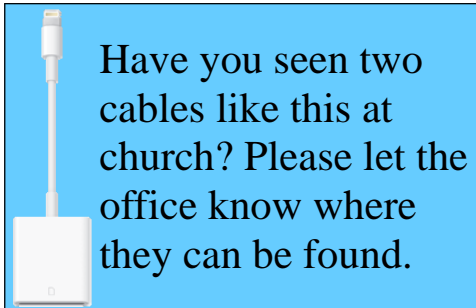


## One Great Hour of Sharing
